The month of December 2023, Laguna Vista Police Department responded to 109 calls for police service in the Town of Laguna Vista. The officers conducted traffic enforcement activities that resulted in 297 traffic stops being conducted. As a result, 141 citations were issued to appear in municipal court and 156 warning citations were issued during this time period.

Highlighted events:

Seven domestic disturbances.

Three DWI arrests.

Three assaults, all resulting in arrest.

Responded to 21 medical calls.

Enforced 31 ordinances.

Two traffic accidents were investigated.

Significant events:

There were NO calls for theft or burglaries in the month of Decemnt.

12/07/23 Training

Focused on water supply, hose deployment and pump operations. Members were asked to go through the process of setting up a hose line from beginning to end. Members started by properly placing the apparatus, engaging the pump, establishing a water supply from the hydrant, deploying the hose lines and flowing water at the desired pressure (depending on length of hose and type of nozzle).

12/21/23 Training

A CPR refresher training focused on the right time to perform CPR, AED deployment and application, airway adjunct selection and placement, compression rates and depth, oxygen administration and BVM placement and proper use. Repetition of training (fire and FRO) is to help produce a more fluid "muscle memory" response when volunteers arrive on scene.





TEXAS HORNED LIZARD

We have had confirmed sightings of the endangered Texas
Horned Lizzard.



The Texas Horned Lizard used to be all over the RGV but they are hard to find now. This is a result of two major issues, 1) their loss of habitat, which our nature trail provides and 2) their one and only food source, harvester ants which we have at our park too!

Since discovering this our team is taking precautions to not spread any ant powder on these ants' colonies. Harvester ants typically only bite when provoked and threatened.

2024 ORAL RABIES VACCINATION PROGRAM



The Texas Department of State Health Services Zoonosis Control Branch will begin the <u>2024 Oral</u> Rabies Vaccination Program's aerial distribution of oral rabies vaccine baits for wildlife on January 9th.

laguna Vista, weather permitting, will start distributing this oral vaccine Monday, January 22, 2024.

The campaign will distribute approximately 820,000 individual vaccine baits along parts of the Texas-Mexico border over approximately two weeks. Target wildlife species include coyotes and gray foxes.

Anyone finding one of the vaccine baits is encouraged to leave it alone, as wildlife can smell the human scent.

The vaccine will not hurt pets or livestock if they consume one of the vaccine baits. It cannot be used in domestic animals as a substitute for the rabies vaccine administered by a veterinarian.

You should wash your hands with soap and water if you have skin contact with the liquid portion (vaccine). If you have an immunocompromising health condition, please inform your family physician immediately about your contact with a live vaccine.
