





The month of January 2024, the Laguna Vista Police Department conducted 280 traffic stops in the Town of Laguna Vista. 124 traffic stops resulted in citations to appear in Municipal Cout before Judge Hunter. There were 156 traffic stops conducted resulting in warnings being issued to drivers.

In addition, the Laguna Vista Police Department responded to 94 calls for service to the citizens of Laguna Vista. Below will highlight some of the call for service.

- · Two people were arrested for assault.
- · Officers are investigating one questionable death.
- · Officers responded to three domestic disturbances.
- · Officers responded to one vehicle fire.
- · One traffic accident was investigated.
- · Ten town ordinances were enforced.
- · Officers responded to 28 medical calls.

Other significant events:

- The tough notebooks (computers) have been delivered and have been put into service for all the officers.
- The new Police Department patrol vehicle is supposed to be arriving this month. This is much needed, and we have been waiting for the vehicle to arrive for sixteen months.
- The Chief of Police is writing and attempting to secure multiple grants for the Police department and the Town of Laguna Vista.

LAGUNA VISTA FIRST RESPONDER ORGANIZATION



January was a very busy month for the Laguna Vista First Responder Organization.

The First Responders responded to a total of 32 emergency calls for assistance. This is a significant number of calls and is a great job by the First Responders due to the importance of medical assistance delivered in the first three minutes of medical emergency crisis and 5 Fire calls.

Fire calls included:

- Water line breach by a contractor on Golf House Rd. Laguna Madre Water District (LMWD)
 responded immediately and had the repair made and service restored in approximately 3 hrs. Kudos
 for an amazing job by the LMWD!
- Passenger vehicle fire on Beach Blvd. Vehicle was fully involved upon dispatch, crews arrived very
 quickly and performed a quick knock down and extinguishment of the fire, no injuries were
 reported.
- Power line down on Orange Lane. No injuries reported, AEP was on scene quickly and made the
 necessary repairs to restore power. A Fire Stick was purchased after this incident to help ensure
 responded safety when responding to this type of incident.
- A possible gas leak was reported on Ocelot Trail. Upon arrival scene was secure and no gas presence was detected. Crews used the 4-gas meter to sample the air from different locations around the residence, no gas was detected.
- Assistance of a physically disabled person. Assist was made without incident.

I would like to encourage residents to please keep an eye on the condition of their outdoor propane cylinders. Most people only consider their gas grill cylinders, but many homes have underground Liquid Propane Gas (LPG) storage tanks at their homes. These tanks are getting older and need to be monitored for safety. If you smell propane in the vicinity of the underground tanks, please call your propane provider and have them checked.

On January 4th fire department training was conducted by Ismael Alcala. Mr. Alcala lectured, demonstrated and the instructed members as they practiced donning and doffing all Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). A quick, smooth donning of gear leads to a quicker, safer response to all incidents requiring structural fire protection PPE. The training practiced donning gear from street clothing all the way to full structural gear, including Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA).

On January 18th Mr. Steve Zarate, owner of Red Line Fire Safety, came to Laguna Vista to deliver an awesome course outlining the proper selection, inspection, use and maintenance of portable fire extinguishers for the home and/or department. The lecture was very interactive, questions were not only answered, but were encouraged. Lecture was followed up with a hands-on demonstration by the instructor. Each attending member of the department was then given an extinguisher and a live fire to extinguish! Mr. Zarate delivered this instruction at no cost to the

department.







HERE ARE SOME WAYS TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM MOSQUITOS:


- INSTALL FANS.






